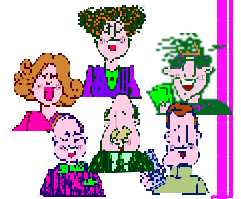

Beautification: Tips & Tidbits on Gardening : beautification@summerfieldnorth.com

- ✿ Are you thinking of planting a summer flower bed, but do not know what to plant? There are many flowers that will grow in this area during the hot summer months. Common plants you will see are Impatiens, Pan-sies, and Azaleas. There are also many other plants that that can enhance your garden and make it an original! Some not so common, but beautiful flowers are: Gazania, Swordleaf Inula, Lychnis Coronaria, Gladiolus, Crocosmia, Petunia, Coneflower, Peony, Heliopsis, and Dianthus.
- ✿ Tomato Tips:- If you planted your tomatoes, you should see some progress in their growth by now. (If you have not planted yet, there is still time- but plant soon!) Remember to tie the tomato plant to the stake or wire cage for support as it grows taller. Also look for little side shoots in the leaf axles. Pinch the side shoots off when they are about $\frac{3}{4}$ in. long. This will help your plant grow stronger and produce better tomatoes. Since you will have green tomatoes first, I have included a great recipe for you to try!
- ✿ Well, it's the time of the year for Beautification to begin choosing our neighborhood 'Yard of the Month' winners. 4 homes per month will be chosen and each winner will receive a small monetary prize plus the honor of having a sign placed in their yard for a month.

Fried Green Tomatoes:

Green tomatoes
Cornmeal
Salt and Pepper
Vegetable oil

Slice tomatoes (not too thin) and roll in cornmeal. Add salt and pepper (to taste). Fry tomatoes in vegetable oil until brown. Place on paper towel to drain. Enjoy!

Mother's Day Cinnamon Toast

- 8 sl White bread
- 1/4 lb Butter, softened
- 2 tsp Cinnamon
- 2 tsp Sugar
- 1 c Granulated brown sugar



Cut crusts from bread. Toast until golden, spread with butter. Mix cinnamon with sugar and granulated brown sugar. Pile on buttered toast. Toast under broiler or in toaster oven until glazed. NOTE: for each additional slice, you will need 1 Tbl. butter, 1/4 tsp cinnamon, 1/4 tsp sugar and 2 Tbl. granulated brown sugar. Makes 6 servings
