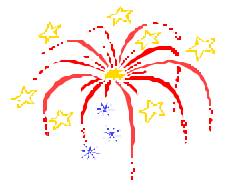


# JULY SNNA NEWSLETTER 2002

## TRASH and RECYCLING REMINDER

- Garbage collections every **Tuesday** and **Friday** - *No stones or rocks*
- Recycling on the **2<sup>nd</sup>** and **4<sup>th</sup>** **Thursdays** (not every 2 weeks)
- Yard waste every Wednesday, placed in a container or large plastic bag
- Household trash, such as boxes, old clothing, small appliances and other such trash, are collected at the curb on the second backyard garbage collection each week - Friday. ('break-down' empty boxes)
- Hazardous waste drop-off is the **1<sup>st</sup>** and **3<sup>rd</sup>** **Saturday** at Wake County landfill off Durant Rd.

### RED, WHITE AND BLUE

- 2 - 3 oz pkgs. blackberry Jell-O
- 1 - can blueberry pie filling
- 2 - 3 oz pkg. lemon Jell-O
- 1 - 8 oz pkg. cream cheese
- 1 - 6 oz Cool Whip
- 2 - 3-oz pkgs. strawberry Jell-O
- 1 box frozen strawberries



Make blackberry Jell-O with 3 cups water instead of 4; stir in pie filling. Pour in deep, rectangular pan; cool until firmly set. Add 1 cup boiling water to lemon Jell-O; beat this into the cream cheese. Cool mixture to room temperature; then fold in Cool Whip. Pour mixture on top of blackberry Jell-O layer; cool until firmly set. Make strawberry Jell-O with 3 cups water instead of 4; stir in frozen strawberries. Cool until room temperature; then pour this mixture on top of cream cheese layer; cool until firmly set. Cut into squares to serve.
