Fifty people turned in a SNNA survey and Lisa Wells has tabulated the results. For those that responded, the three most important community items are Community Watch, the newsletter and the neighborhood directory. If you missed filling out a survey, drop me a line and I'll get you a copy. The SNNA board wants to make decisions that are based upon the neighborhood's consensus, so please fill one out if you haven't al-

ready. If you'd like a copy of the results, contact me and I'll send it your way.

Rod Simpkins is working to get Community Watch information to everyone on a timely basis. Last month, Rod sent an alert out via email and that seemed to work well. If you haven't sent me your email address, now is the time to do so. Your email address will be used by Rod for Community Watch alerts and by me for SNNA board meeting summaries. We have no plans to use your address in any other way and will ask your permission before doing so.

According to the SNNA survey, the SNNA website is least important attribute of our neighborhood. The Website Committee is working on the website to make it easier to use and to ensure that it always has current information. Like all SNNA committees, we depend upon the efforts of volunteers who work they can, so look for website improvements in the next month or two.

The most important item, though, is the

neighborhood directory -- the "Green Book". As this newsletter goes to press, the process of updating the directory database should be complete. A draft copy will be printed, block captains will confer with neighbors to ensure accuracy and then it's off to the printer.

The Constitution & By-Laws committee has made good progress on identifying areas that may merit change and has set out a schedule for editing and review by the board that will lead to a review and comments period by the neighborhood, followed by a vote. The entire process should take most of the year, allowing for careful, deliberate consideration.

## Community Watch Rod Simpkins

The SNNA website has recently been updated to include Community Watch "Alerts" and will soon have the ability to email new alerts to anyone who has signed up to receive them. Our most recent alert involving a neighborhood walker is posted in the Alerts section. For those of you who do not have internet access and need info about this incident, please call me. For future concerns or to report a problem, our new block captains will be the point of contact for each section. They will be the liaison between their assigned block neighbors and the Community

Watch committee.

Walking is good exercise and can be a family event. There are a few things you can do to thwart trouble during your walks. First, carry a cell phone if you have one. Second, walk with confidence and be aware of what is happening in all directions. Third, as you approach another person, make eye contact with them to be friendly and to let them know that you are aware of their presence. If someone is thinking of causing trouble, they tend to avoid people that have "identified" them visually.

We have some new mailbox signs for anyone that needs one. The fee of \$6.00 covers the cost of making them through the Raleigh Police Dept. I currently have a box of 20 and can order more if we need to. Finally, a SAFETY DAY is in the early planning stages but no date has been set yet for the event. It will include Police and Fire Dept. demonstrations, etc. If you have suggestions for things you would like to see, call our committee or the Social committee or email us your ideas. Thanks for helping keep us all safe.
