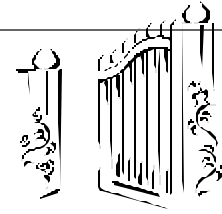

The National Do Not Call Registry is now operational! Most telemarketers (excluding charities, political organizations, and some surveys) cannot call your telephone number if it is registered. You can register your home

and mobile phone numbers for free. Your registration will be effective for five years. It will be illegal for most telemarketers to call you, and you will be able to file a complaint if a telemarketer does call you. The web site

If you have trouble getting through the first time, try again later as the website has been deluged with registrations.

Just a few notes for the summer months:

*Gardens should be well mulched to retain moisture & help control those summer weeds.

*It is not too late to add color - zinnias, marigolds, salvia, petunias all do well in the summer sun!

*Hydrangeas are beautiful now! Cut them (vertically) and other flowers in the AM, strip leaves & place in water im-

mediately.

*Here's a great flower preservative from Southern Living: 1 T sugar, 2 t lemon juice, 1/2 t bleach, 3 c water. Just add 2 T to your vase and change water every 2 days. Several exciting garden projects are going on now - thanks for your efforts to keep our neighborhood looking good!

Let's Talk Trash

Our Recycling schedule is every other Wednesday beginning this month with July 2, followed by July 16 and 30. Trash pickup for our neighborhood is every Tuesday and Friday with a Wednesday yard waste pickup. For those of you unaware, the Raleigh Solid Waste Services will only pick up yard waste if it is either placed in yard bags or in

trash cans and placed at the curb. Limbs must be no longer than about your arm length and bundled (not tossed in a pile in the road). Exceptions to that rule are after floods and hurricanes. If you've had a pile of debris in front of your house for longer than a week, you can bet it's not going to be picked up. Please take a few minutes to clean up

the pile, using one of the 3 methods explained, and help keep our neighborhood looking spic and span.
