Pool & Tennis Board to Resurface the Courts

The Pool and Tennis Club will have newly resurfaced tennis courts very soon. At the July 28 Board of Directors meeting, by a unanimous vote, the board gave its go ahead for this important investment.

Construction is expected to begin shortly after the pool season ends, and depending upon weather, should finish within 6-8 weeks from the start date. The Board had been putting off this investment for most of the past 2 years. Herb Young, President of the Association stated, we wanted to be as fiscally responsible as possible by waiting, however the courts condition has deteriorated to the point where we felt it was diminishing the value of our community. We have planned for this moment and we have the necessary capital reserves.

Once the courts are finished, a self-closing and locking door will be installed. All pool and tennis members will be issued a key that will be available through Talis Management. The Board hopes this system will help protect the investment and requests all families to help keep bikes, skate boards, roller blades, etc. off the courts.

Board member and Tennis Committee Chair, Ken Brody, plans to find a tennis instructor from the area willing to set up clinics, lessons, ladders, and possibly tournaments for our community. If anyone from our neighborhood is qualified and would like to explore this opportunity further, please contact Ken by email (kbrody@krw.net) or at home (870-0776). I also would love for all tennis playing members of our community, no matter their age, ability, or frequency, to introduce themselves to me, preferably by email. Once we have a better idea of who the players are, and their abilities, we can better organize for the future. More tennis information will be forthcoming.

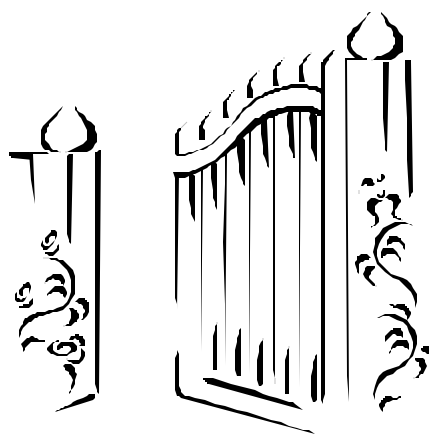
