**Rain or Shine, we parade!**

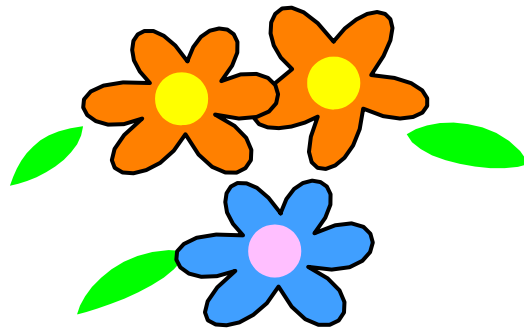


## Annual Elections

## Community Watch — Rod Simpkins

COMMUNITY WATCH WORKS! Some alert neighbors on Clear Brook Drive thwarted a bicycle theft in late March. A group of boys was seen trying to take the bike from behind a neighbor's house. After being spotted, they dropped the bike and left. Neighbors called the police to report what they had seen and done. The boys were not caught but they have not been seen in the area again. Our area has had several bicycle thefts in recent years so remember to keep them secured when they are not being used. Despite police efforts, bicycles are rarely found after being stolen.

For those of you who have packages (UPS, FedEx, etc.) delivered to your homes - beware. I received a report last month from a neighbor on Old Deer Trail near Strickland road about a package theft. Someone had opened the package, removed the \$700 CARSON binoculars, and left the empty box in the bushes next to the front door. The incident occurred on April 5th between 2 and 4pm. Please call Community Watch if you have any information. You may want to re-evaluate how packages are delivered to your home in order to safeguard your items.

We also received a report that a motorist had exposed himself to a teenage girl while "asking for directions". The 14 yr. old girl was walking her dog near the Heathfield / Mourning Dove area when a small, blue SUV stopped and the driver motioned the girl over for directions. As she approached the car, she noticed the indecency and immediately left. Please remind you children to NEVER approach and get near a stranger's vehicle.

As you have read, our area is not immune to problems. We can, however, keep them to a minimum by staying informed and alert when it comes to our safety and that of our neighbors. Thanks for your help.

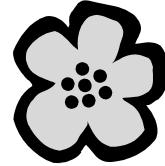
## Pool Open House — May 31st

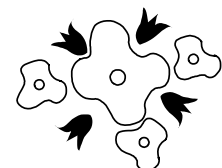
