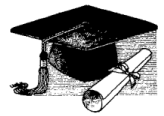

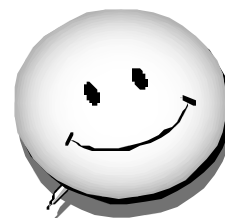

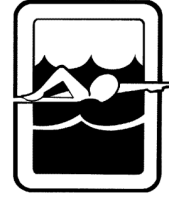


## Summerfield North Swim Team — Carolyn Ball

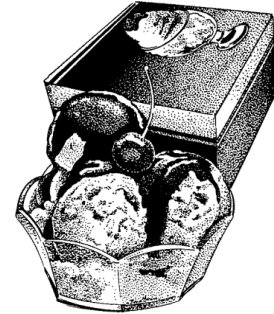
