SNNA Annual Membership Drive

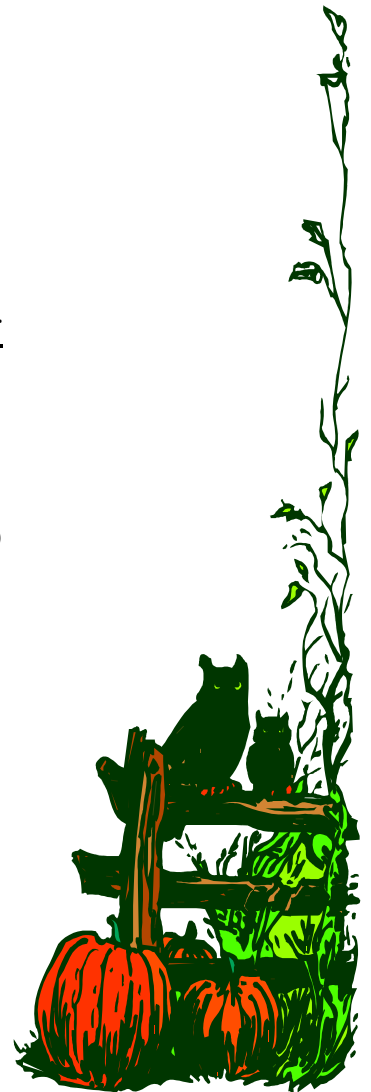

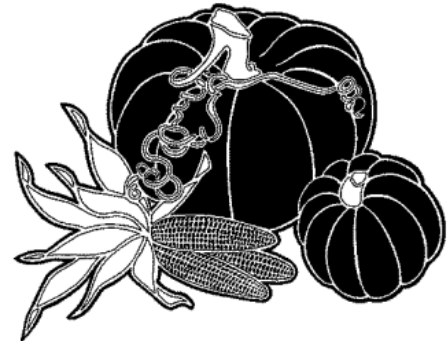

FRONT ENTRANCE REVITALIZATION

The project to revitalize the front entrances continues to move ahead. This project will gain momentum over next few months, and hopefully be implemented by the spring planting season. We are currently talking to contractors and to the City of Raleigh so we can put together a reasonable cost estimate for this project. We expect to approach the Summerfield North/Wycombe Homeowners Association with a proposal to request their assistance with this project at their budget meeting on the 25th of October.

NEIGHBORHOOD PLAYGROUND

A group of neighbors has taken up the challenge of getting a playground built in our neighborhood. Later this month a proposal will be submitted to the Summerfield North - Wycombe Homeowner's Association (Otherwise known as the Talis Board) requesting a new playground near the pool and tennis courts. The success of this venture will depend on the active support of our neighborhood.
