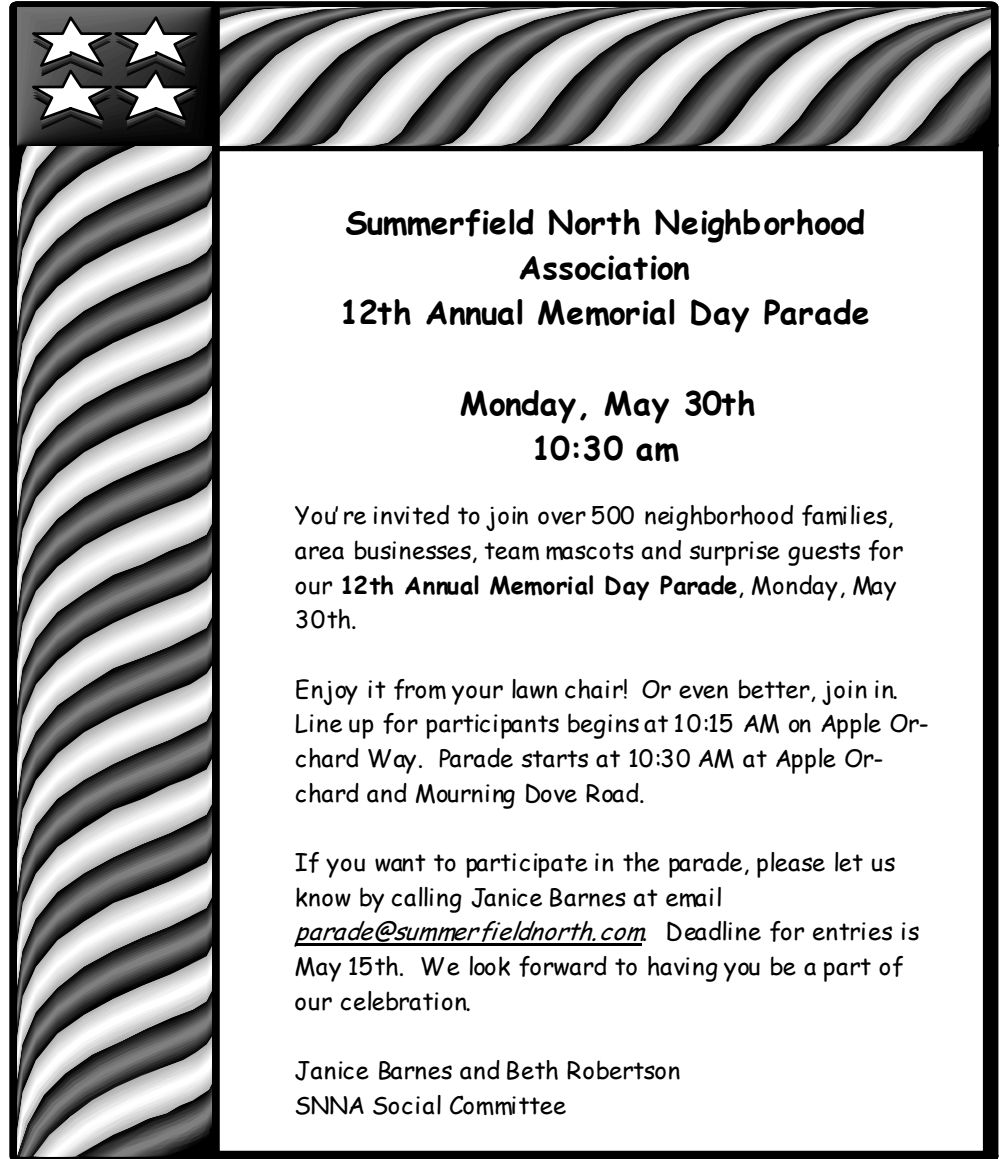

Election Results

The elections for the Summerfield North - Wycombe Manor Homeowners Association were held on April 26th and the results are as follows:

For the one available Class C (Summerfield Mandatory) seat, Barb Gaunce was re-elected. She was unopposed for that seat.

For the three Class D (Pool Board) seats, the three candidates from the voluntary section of Summerfield North were elected. They are Sheri Colquitt, David Wells, and David Mykins.

It is noteworthy that the results of the election for the Class D seats is unchanged whether you count the voluntary member's votes or not. We had enough votes from the mandatory members, and supporters in Wycombe, to win the seats without the disputed voluntary member's votes.

The credit for this success is largely due to the tireless efforts of Sheri Colquitt, and Beth Robertson who with the help of a few other folks collected the necessary proxies to carry the election. Please make it a point to thank these folks the next time you see them for the many hours they put into making this happen.

I know that some of you may have been waiting to see how this drama all turned out before sending in your dues. Well now that it is settled, I hope that you will all go ahead and join. The pool is convenient, fun and a great way to connect with your neighbors, both old and new. Remember that you must be a member of the pool in order to join the swim team.
