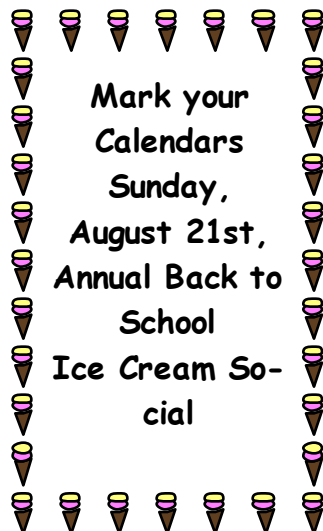
Welcome to the Social Committee:
