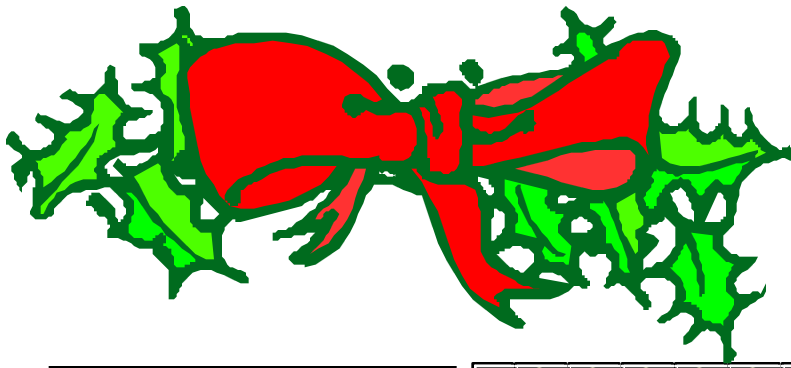

Change to Newsletter Delivery

The SNNA board recently voted to discontinue the delivery of newsletters and directories to non-members. This is a return to the policy that had been followed up until a few years ago. There was much discussion on this topic over a couple board meetings, but in the end, the board decided that it wasn't fair to paying members to distribute them to non-members. If you have been meaning to join SNNA, please do so as soon as possible to avoid missing any newsletters.

If you are new to the neighborhood, or debating whether to join, SNNA is a key part of our neighborhood, providing valuable services, which make our neighborhood fun and help to keep our property values up. A mere \$30 annually covers the cost of activities such as the newsletters, directories, luminaries, Fall Festival, Spring Fling, parade-related expenses, sleigh rides, ice cream social, adult social, entrance common area maintenance, etc. SNNA also runs the neighborhood web site and the Community Watch program, publishing alerts through its email database. It is SNNA that sponsors the new neighbor welcome baskets, and the Yard of the Month. Finally, SNNA's funds keep the lights on at the neighborhood entrance signs.
