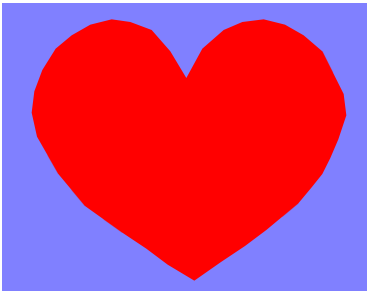

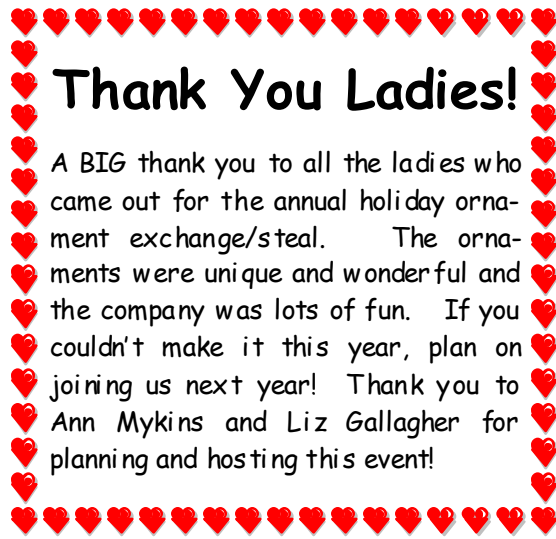

Community Watch—Jim Gallagher

I'm happy to report that we have a safe and secure neighborhood mainly because we have good communication between neighbors. SNNA has maintained a community watch group for long time. There is a community watch email alert service accessed from the SNNA website (www.summerfieldnorth.com) when you want to inform us. If something happens that disturbs you, please dial 911 to call the police and report the situation. They will show up fast. A few years ago I noticed a strange car on my street. It looked suspicious so I called the police. The officer arrived shortly afterward and "ran the plates" to see if the car was stolen. I told him I felt embarrassed. He explained that burglars sometimes steal a car and leave it several blocks from the house(s) that they planned to rob to have a clean get away. We would have caught the thieves if that was the case. The officer thanked me and asked me to keep my eyes open. We're all safe because we are looking out for each other. We're not easy targets. The community watch committee tries to ensure good communication between the SNNA board, the neighborhood and the police. We keep up with what other neighborhoods are doing and keep in contact with the West Millbrook School. Along the communication lines, the SNNA board uses an email distribution to remind or alert the neighborhood of events and late breaking news to you when necessary. Do we have your email address?
