Community Watch—Jim Gallagher

Here's a few timeless messages we need to share periodically:

1. Always lock your doors, house and car. If you return to find a door open, do not enter, call the police from a neighbor's house. If you always lock, someone else unlocked.
2. Keep your car off the street to protect it.
3. Trim bushes that are close to your house that can hide someone.
4. Make sure your garage door closes completely. They hit things and go back up sometimes. It's an invitation and they can tell if no one is home.
5. If you travel and leave your house alone for several days, tell your neighbors. Ask neighbors to watch your house and to collect mail and newspaper. You can stop mail at post office also.
6. Check your smoke alarms by pushing the button. Replace battery if silent.
7. Check that your family has fire escape routes from their bedrooms.
8. Discuss what to do in case of fire and perform a fire drill.
9. Purchase chain ladders to store under beds for 2nd story rooms that are too high to jump out of in a fire drill. Perform the fire drill with the ladders if they were not available on first try.
10. Make sure you all know where to meet if an emergency escape is necessary. You will want to know that everyone is accounted for.
11. Make sure you have fire extinguishers in the kitchen.
