## Stage II—Water Restrictions

As many of you are aware, our area is experiencing a drought. During this time of year many of us would like to water our lawns, shrubs, and trees to give them the water they so desperately need. Unfortunately, due to the drought, the City of Raleigh has been forced to implement Stage II water conservation measures so that all of us will have the water we need for basic functions such as drinking, cooking, and bathing. The fines for violating the Stage II restrictions are significant, \$200 for first offense \$1,000 for second offense, and the third offense will result in water service being shut off. Obviously none of us want to be fined or have our water shut off so the SNNA Board thought it would be a good idea to notify our members of when they can water.

Automatic irrigation systems - Watering shall be applied only between the hours of midnight to 5:00 a.m. and/or 10:00 p.m. to midnight on their designated days. Persons with odd numbered addresses may water on Tuesdays and Saturdays, persons with even numbered addresses may water on Wednesdays and Sundays.

Hose end sprinkler systems - Watering shall be applied only between the hours of midnight to 6:00 a.m. and/or 6:00 p.m. to midnight on their designated days. Persons with odd numbered addresses may water on Tuesdays and Saturdays, persons with even numbered addresses may water on Wednesdays and Sundays.

Hand held watering devices - Hand held watering may be applied between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. seven days a week.

Vehicle washing - Vehicles may be washed only at commercial car wash establishments.

Power washing - Power washing may be performed only by professional power washing companies.

Please keep in mind that the fines and restrictions were current as of this writing (14-Mar-06).
