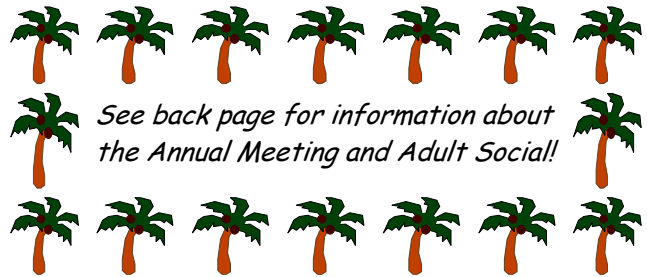
Memorial Day Parade Thank You
