## Lawn and Garden Tips:

I have found a fertilizer that works great on the lawn. Your lawn will look as good or better than a lawn service. Scott's fertilizers are best in the Ohio Valley,

but they have agreements with stores here, so they are sold here.

I like Preen n Green's Lawn Fall Weed Control plus fertilizer. This little bag lasts all Fall. Put it down with your bag of Lime and your fescue lawn is beautiful. Then apply Preen n Green's product once in the spring with your lime and you're set for next summer. Also, you must treat fescue right and mow high and do not bag. The grass recycles the fertilizer all summer long.

Scott's has deals with stores here, so it is hard to get Preen n Green for the Lawn. I used to go up to Creedmoor to the Southern States and get it, but have found that Ace Hardware on the corner of Ravenridge and Durant will order it and have it in days.

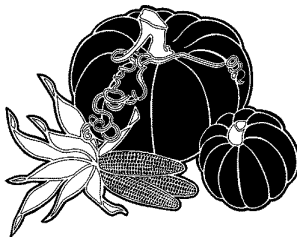
Don't know if you can use this, but as the daughter of a soil scientist I'm telling this stuff is great!!
