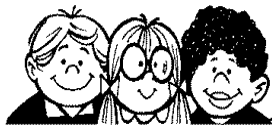

Mandatory Year-Round Water Conservation Measures

The Raleigh City Council voted unanimously May 15, 2007, to approve year-round lawn irrigation water conservation measures beginning July 2, 2007.

The new rules will apply to City water customers who use automatic and non-automatic irrigation systems and garden hose-attached sprinklers to water their lawns. Starting July 2, residents with these systems who have odd-numbered addresses will be allowed to water their lawns and outdoor plants on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. Even-numbered addresses can water on Wednesday, Friday and Sunday. Lawn irrigation using automatic or non-automatic irrigation systems or hose-attached sprinklers will **NOT** be allowed on Monday. Use the chart below for reference.

Residents who use hand-held hoses will be exempt from the year-round rules and can water lawns and outdoor plants at anytime.

A written warning notice would be issued for a first violation of the mandatory year-round water restrictions. A second violation would be a \$50 fine, and a third violation would result in a \$200 civil penalty. A fourth violation would be termination of the customer's water service.
