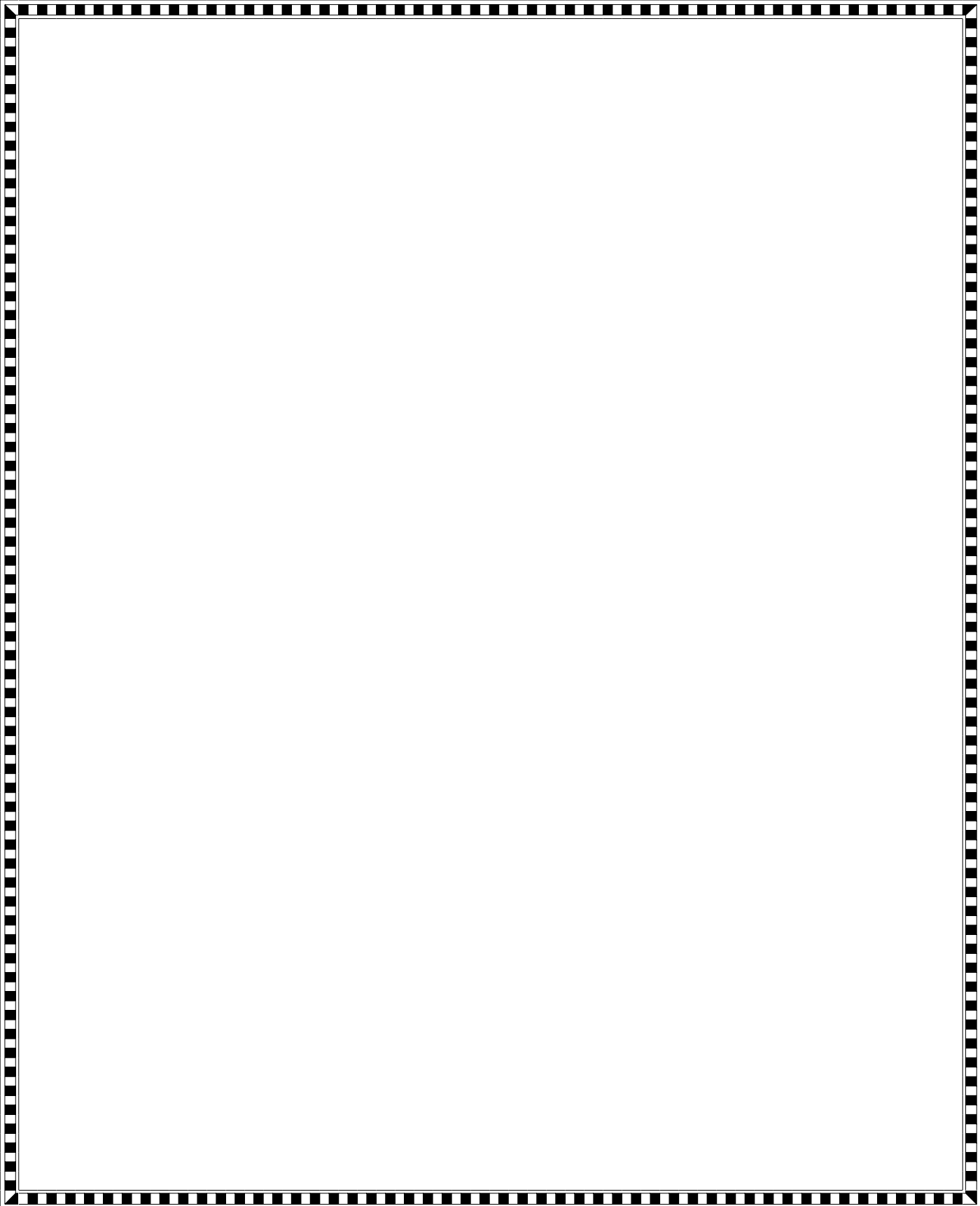
Annual Board Elections
