Honeycutt Creek Greenway Project Update

On March 2nd, the Raleigh City Council approved Greenway Plan Alternate #4 through Summerfield North. This greenway trail will be composed of both new paved trails through wooded portions of land already owned by the City of Raleigh that stretches from Old Deer Trail to Clearbrook Drive. At the point where the wooded trail enters upon Clearbrook Drive the greenway will continue upon existing paved sidewalks that run along the roads of Clearbrook, Mourning Dove and Running Cedar. It is expected that construction could commence in the Fall/Winter months of 2010 for the new greenway as this portion of the trail will be a piece to a larger planned greenway system aka Honeycutt Trail, which will eventually connect both Shelly Lake and Falls Lake with our neighborhood.
